- The NCRAR has funding for a full year Au.D. externship position
- You will participate in multiple aspects of clinical research such as participant recruitment and testing, adherence to research protocols applying human subject participation regulations, writing of clinical notes and data entry.
- You will conduct a variety of clinical research procedures including audiometric testing, hearing aid fitting, central auditory processing testing, electroacoustic testing of hearing aids, tinnitus assessment and treatment and electrophysiological methods (ABR, EPs, OAEs)
- Additional benefits include attending NCRAR seminars and research meetings, participating in the grant-writing process, preparing publications and conference presentations, and conducting statistical analyses of research data.



Application deadline is December 1st 2011. Decisions about acceptance to the program will be made by January 15th 2012.
